Wednesday 10 March 2026 – Atelier Pierre believes that meaningful design grows alongside us. Some objects become part of our daily rituals, subtly shaping the atmosphere around us. This year, the beloved Dentelles collection enters a new chapter. During Antwerp Design Week 2026, Atelier Pierre reveals the new Dentelles collection, bringing its iconic, doily-inspired silhouette into a new era with flexible multi-kelvin lighting, as well as dim capability. The same character and soul. The same recognisable shape. Now with even more control over the mood you want to create.

Farewell Dentelles. You were loved.

Dentelles first came to life in 2021, inspired by the delicate paper doilies once used by Lieven Vanhalst, son of “Pierre”, and Jenny Larridon, founders of the West-Flemish family business Vanhalst, in their Pastry Shop back in the 70’s. Designers Paulien and Kaat translated this nostalgic memory into a modern object: a stack of lace-like layers that feels both refined and stylish. It is therefore no coincidence that the French word ‘elles’ appears in the name, referring to “les filles” – the two designer girls. Wireless, dimmable, indoor-outdoor capable, and made from 100% recyclable polyethylene, the original Dentelles ticked *almost* every box. Moving from dining table to garden party with ease, always creating a sense of conviviality.

Hello again Dentelles. Welcome to the next chapter.

The new Dentelles introduces multi-kelvin lighting – a first for Atelier Pierre, offering more versatility than ever before. While the original already offered four dim levels and a fixation mode to lock your preferred brightness, the new Dentelles now gives you full control over both brightness *and* colour temperature. An additional button allows you to choose between three light tones – a warm, candlelit amber for intimate dinners, a balanced everyday glow or a crisp daylight white for a morning table setting.

A new built-in battery indicator at the bottom of the lamp ensures the atmosphere never fades unexpectedly. As always, Dentelles remains cordless, rechargeable via USB-C and easy to dim with a tap on top or with the button underneath. Multi-kelvin lighting is the natural next step for Dentelles: now the lamp doesn’t just set a mood, it lets you choose exactly which one.

Authentically Atelier Pierre

While the lighting technology evolves, the essence of Dentelles remains: thoughtful Belgian design, sustainable materials, and a focus on conviviality. The new collection comes in five sizes, all with a white body. Each lamp has a metal base, exclusively available in a golden finish across the entire size range. Every lampshade is still made from 100% recycled polyethylene and remains fully recyclable when sorted correctly. Next to this golden range, Dentelles Earth remains available in three shapes, featuring a beige body made from 100% recycled polyethylene and its signature chocolate-coloured metal ring.
